From Darrel's Desk . . .

This year, July 4th is on a Sunday. I got curious about how often July 4th falls on a Sunday. After careful investigation, I discovered that July 4th falls on a Sunday every year in which July 3rd falls on a Saturday. (OK, seriously, I do not know how often the 4th of July falls on a Sunday.)



On the 4th of July, we celebrate the anniversary of the adoption of the Declaration of Independence. Sticklers for detail may tell you that the Declaration was not signed on July 4, 1776. And they would be correct. Most of the delegates to the Continental Congress actually signed the Declaration of Independence on August 2nd. The legal separation of the American colonies from Great Britain actually occurred on July 2, 1776, when the Second Continental Congress voted to approve a resolution of independence. But the delegates debated and revised the written Declaration of Independence for a couple of days and finally approved the wording on July 4th. And that is what we celebrate.

As I said before, I do not know how often the 4th of July falls on a Sunday but I know that Independence Day falls on a Sunday 52 times a year. Every Sunday, we gather to remember the price that was paid so that we could be freed from the consequences of our sin. In Galatians 5, when Paul wrote: *"It is for freedom that Christ has set us free. Stand firm, then, and do not let yourselves be burdened again by a yoke of slavery"* he was reminding us that we have been liberated from the obligations of the Old Testament Law.

For the Christian, every Sunday is Independence Day...to be celebrated with praise and adoration of the God of the universe, with a family meal at the Lord's Table and with sacrifices of His tithes and our offerings. Fireworks entertain us but worship exalts Him.

AT NO EXTRA CHARGE:

In 1st Peter 2:13-16, the great apostle wrote: *13Submit yourselves for the Lord's sake to every authority instituted among men: whether to the king, as the supreme authority, 14or to governors, who are sent by him to punish those who do wrong and to commend those who do right. 15For it is God's will that by doing good you should silence the ignorant talk of foolish men. 16Live as free men, but do not use your freedom as a cover-up for evil; live as servants of God.*

It is an interesting juxtaposition for Peter to command us to submit ourselves "to every authority instituted among men" and then turn right around and urge us to live as free men. Freedom and submission? What is his point?

The key to understanding and practicing this teaching is to grasp the second phrase: "for the Lord's sake". As Christians, a way of bringing honor to the Name that we wear is to choose to live in submission to the authorities that have been put in place to order our society.

Ah, but Peter wouldn't have written that if he had anticipated rogue governments, would he? Well, Simon Peter suffered persecution at the hands of the Roman government. He believed that Christians should work through the system. That's something worth thinking about during these tumultuous times.
