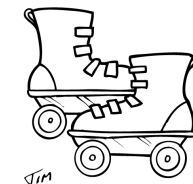

It is called "Daylight Saving Time" but you can't, you know. You can't "save" time. You can learn to use it more effectively or more efficiently but you cannot actually "save" time. You can't put it in a vault where it will be stored until a later date when you want or need it.



Many wish they could save time. They would love to bank some time so they could withdraw a few hours when they run out of day before they run out of duties. Or, perhaps, let time accrue until vacation and then make each week 10 days long. Some really need to have some time on deposit so when they come to the end of their lives, they can withdraw a few years to use more wisely than the years they have already spent.

If you had a couple of years in the bank, how do you suppose you would use them at the far end of your life? Do you suppose you would spend them with your children, grandchildren and other family members? Think you might take some walks, gaze at some sunsets and smell some roses? Perhaps you would use those years to nurture your soul and to strengthen your relationship with the Heavenly Father you will be meeting very soon. Possibly you would be more regular in your church attendance so you could develop relationships with those with whom you want to spend eternity.

What wouldn't you do with those couple of years you had on deposit? Probably wouldn't work a lot of over-time. I doubt that you would spend it accumulating wealth, assets or holdings. It is unlikely that you would spend them in trivial pursuits.

As I said before, you cannot really save time: it is gifted to you one second at a time. There are 31,556,926 seconds in a year and you never know when the clock of your life will begin to count down the last 31,556,926. That being the case, he is wise who lives each year as if it will be his last...because sometime it will be.
